### Grade II\*

**Doncaster Minster** Edmund Schulze 1862 V/92 NPOR ref: N02902  
Awarded for surviving influential Schulze material

**Tyldesley Top Chapel, Lancashire** John Nicholson 1859 II/18 NPOR ref: M00074  
Significant example of John Nicholson's work.

**St Cuthbert, Cubert, Cornwall** Henry Willis 1894 II/15 NPOR ref: D06459  
Originally commissioned for Llanhydrock House. Handsomely built and in original condition.

**Methodist Chapel, St Erth, Cornwall** Forster & Andrews 1864 II/14 NPOR ref: K00170  
In original condition (apart from one rank). Interesting and richly decorated case.

**Holy Cross Monastery, Ardoyne, Belfast** Evans & Barr 1926 III/36 NPOR ref: C00374  
Important unaltered surviving organ by a leading local firm of the time.

### Grade II

**Langholm Parish Church, Dumfriesshire** Henry Willis 1893 II/19 NPOR ref: D05233  
Retaining original Barker Lever key action and the nucleus of the original tonal scheme.

**St Michael, Wandsworth Common London** Henry Jones 1897 III/24 NPOR ref: D08301  
One of the largest surviving Henry Jones. Original tonal scheme and manual key actions.

**All Saints', Lydd, Kent** Henry Willis 1880 II/13 NPOR ref: N14818  
Installed 1946. Modest but largely unaltered Father Willis.

**St Peter, Stoke Fleming, Devon** Bryceson Bros 1887 II/16 NPOR ref: N10517  
Surviving Bryceson with strikingly-decorated front pipes.

**Methodist Church, Brompton-on Swale N.Yorkshire** Lewis & co 1894 II/10 NPOR ref: G00927  
Well-preserved late T.C.Lewis small instrument.
