Grade II*

St Joseph, Birkdale, Merseyside Henry Ainscough 1885 2/18 NPOR ref: C00165
Original early pneumatic action. Divided cases

All Saints', Wellington, Shropshire Bevington c.1879 3/25 NPOR ref: N04640
A comparatively large Bevington, moved and altered by them in 1898 but unaltered since.

St Mary, Acton, London J.W.Walker 1876 & 1894 3/29 NPOR ref: D02539
Enlarged by Walker in 1894, it retains the original 1894 tubular pneumatic action

Christ Church, Southampton Bevington 1865 3/22 NPOR ref: N18687
Early 19c. Gothic revival case and 11 ranks of pipes by G.P. England. Not currently playable.

St Wilfrid, Kelham, Notts. Positive 1906 1/9 NPOR ref: M00089
Listed solely for the beautiful case by Temple Moore

Congregational Church, Wavertree, Liverpool
Henry Willis 1873 2/18 NPOR ref: H00947
From the mid-point of Henry Willis's career, with minor later additions in the early 20th c.

St Paul, Irton, Cumbria John Nicholson 1874 2/18 NPOR ref: D07783
The only John Nicholson of Worcester organ in Cumbria. Largely unaltered.

St Andrew, Boscombe, Hampshire Hill & Son 1908 3/24 NPOR ref: N11491
A typical late Hill in a case by J.Oldrid Scott (Freeman 629 & 630, plates 882 & 883)

Ss Peter & Paul, Shalden, Hampshire J.W.Walker 1873 1/7 NPOR ref: E01882
Typical and unaltered mid-period Walker. Plain front pipes.

St John's Methodist, St Austell, Cornwall Hele & Co. 1924 3/29 NPOR ref: N02219
Late example of tubular action by noted Plymouth builder. Notable case from 1856 instrument.

St Clement's Congregational, Ipswich Bishop & Son 1909 2/18 NPOR ref: V00319
Robustly-voiced Edwardian Bishop instrument made in Ipswich.

St Mary, Bishopstoke, Hampshire H.C.Sims 1891 2/17 NPOR ref: V00319
Rare organ by local Southampton-based organ builder.
